Chairman Kavanaugh convened the meeting at 1:00 p.m. In attendance, confirmed by roll call were Charles Keller and Taylor Thomas (Snell and Wilmer); Anne Ryman (ABC15); Candy Gylinsey (Suntree Snack Foods, LLC); Tom Stack (Pinnacle West); and David Oatman (We Buy Scrap).

Approval of Minutes of February 6, 2025 Regular Meeting Minutes.

Commissioner Everett moved to approve the Minutes of the February 6, 2025 regular session meeting and Commissioner Godfrey seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett, Commissioner Valdez and Commissioner Godfrey voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Consent Agenda:

All are consent matters and will be considered by a single motion with no discussion unless a Commissioner asks to remove an item on the consent agenda to be discussed and voted on separately. The Commission may move into Executive Session under A.R.S. § 38-431.03(A)(2) to discuss records exempt by law from public inspection. Legal action involving a final vote or decision shall not be taken in Executive Session. If such action is required, then it will be taken in General Session.

a. Approval of Arizona Division of Occupational Safety and Health Proposed Citations and Penalties Less Than \$15,000.

Chairman Kavanaugh confirmed with Mr. Hudson that Arizona Public Service Company and Bay Valve, LLC were related.

Commissioner Valdez moved to approve the items on the Consent Agenda and Vice Chair Hennelly seconded the motion. Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett, Commissioner Valdez and Commissioner Godfrey voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Discussion and Action regarding Proposed Retaliation Penalty.

1. RT-2425-0057 Oxford Bank Corporation

Ms. Spurgeon summarized the Labor Department's investigation into the Earned Paid Sick Time (EPST) Retaliation claim. Ms. Spurgeon recommended that the Commission approve issuance of a Penalty in the amount of \$19,826.25 for lost wages and \$10,000.00 to deter future termination violations in violation of A.R.S. § 23-364.

Commissioner Everett and Ms. Spurgeon discussed the exemption for the number of employees according to A.R.S. § 23-372(B) if they have less the 15 employees they are still entitled to sick time; however, their entitlement is 24 hours per year instead of 40. They also discussed the employer could have denied the sick time per their policy but instead allowed an exception thereby protecting that date.

Commissioner Valdez moved to approve issuance of a Penalty for Retaliation in the amount of \$29,826.25 to Oxford Bank Corporation. Commissioner Godfrey seconded the motion.

Commissioner Godfrey asked if there were suggestions to bring awareness to employers and employees on how these situations can be navigated. Ms. Spurgeon responded that the employers are notified about the claims and the statute §23-364(B) and have an opportunity to correct and stop the accruing penalties.

Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett, Commissioner Valdez and Commissioner Godfrey voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

2. RT-2425-0077 K&N Ventures, LLC DBA V'S Barbershop

Ms. Spurgeon summarized the Labor Department's investigation into the Earned Paid Sick Time (EPST) Retaliation claim. Ms. Spurgeon recommended that the Commission approve issuance of a Penalty in the amount of \$27,014.12 for lost wages and \$10,000.00 to deter future termination violations in violation of A.R.S. § 23-364.

Chairman Kavanaugh asked if the Commissioners had any questions.

Commissioner Godfrey moved to approve issuance of a Penalty for Retaliation in the amount of \$37,014.12 to K&N Ventures, LLC DBA V'S Barbershop. Commissioner Valdez seconded the motion Chairman Kavanaugh, Vice Chair Hennelly, Commissioner Everett, Commissioner Valdez and Commissioner Godfrey voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Ms. Gylinsey wanted to ask a question to educate herself and the company. If her company abated citations in a fast timely manner, back up documentation was sent to ADOSH, she asked if it gets put into consideration for review for potential reductions in citations or is the citation automatically given when it is found?

Chairman Kavanaugh noted the Commission does not ignore comments or input on actions that the employer takes. Mr. Hudson explained the process with abatement.

Vice Chair Hennelly asked if abatement was received in this case. Mr. Hudson noted that information was not available. Vice Chair Hennelly noted he knows that consideration will be given for abatement as brought up in the course of the development of this matter.
