Chairman Schultz convened the meeting at 1:00 p.m. Also in attendance were Robert Stolz and Paul (Pat) Terry with Arizona Department of Transportation; Dewayne Boerner with Electric Service & Control Systems; and Jason Weber with Snell & Wilmer.

Approval of Minutes of December 8, 2016 Regular Meeting.

Commissioner LeMarr moved to approve the Minutes of the December 8, 2016 regular session meeting and Vice Chair Hennelly seconded the motion. Chairman Schultz, Vice Chair Hennelly, and Commissioner LeMarr voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

Consent Agenda:

<u>SERIOUS</u> – Citation 1 - Item 2 – 7225 W Sherman St, Phoenix, AZ 85043: An employee was pulling a ground wire through the service entrance section (SES) to connect an existing switchgear's ground to provide grounding for new switchgear to be installed at the facility and the employee was not protected against electrical shock by deenergizing and grounding the circuits or effectively guarding the circuits by insulation or other means. 29 CFR 1926.416(a)(1).

Chairman Schultz, Vice Chair Hennelly, and Commissioner LeMarr voted in favor of the motion. The motion passed.

a) Worship Center: Seven employees were working from wood roof trusses which did not have requisite strength and structural integrity to support them. (29 CFR 1926.501(a)(2)).

b) Worship Center: Seven employees were working from roof trusses without the use of a guardrail system, safety net system, or personal fall arrest systems to prevent an approximate sixteen foot fall to the concrete floor below. (29 CFR 1926.501(b)(1)).
